- (2) Nature of operations: Principally anti-communications, i.e. against bridges. Extensive ground support was given to the Eighth Army in its attack on Faenza.

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## (3) Number of missions and sorties :

44 Missions  
836 Sorties (a new group record)  
1,107 Tons of bombs dropped

## (4) Results of the most important missions.

(a) In a concerted attack on the Brenner Pass RR we were assigned three targets; on Nov 6 1944

Rovereto RR Bridge

Rovereto Rail Fill

Calliano RR Bridge

All three were solidly hit and put out of commission.

(b) We commenced operations against Yugoslavia on 17 November by bombing the Obedisce RR Bridge with fair success.

(c) From 21 to 24 Nov, incl, 10 missions (192 sorties) were run against Faenza defense areas, in support of the Eighth Army's drive to take the town.

(d) Outstanding bombing job of the month was done on the Casale Monferrato on 28 November, when the bridge was virtually destroyed.

(e) In its first month's operations with a new aircraft, 319th Group at once asserted its superiority by destroying more bridges than any other group in the wing.

## (5) Enemy opposition: No air opposition. Flak was irregular; mostly inaccurate. One plane lost.

h. Command Officers on important missions

- (1) Colonel J. R. Holzapple led group against Rovereto RR Fill.
- (2) Lt. Col. John A. Orb led group against Faenza Def. Area 1.
- (3) Lt. Col. C. R. Meyers, Jr. led group against Orto Litta RR Bridge.

i. Losses in action, officers and enlisted men.

- (1) Killed: None
- (2) Wounded: Six
- (3) Missing: Seven
- (4) P/W: None

Two men, previously reported missing, evaded capture and returned to duty.
